No residents are currently in hospital.



The Care home is running on a full staffing compliment although there is some agency usage, this is regular agency staff. All staff are bearing up well under the pressure of the lockdown and appreciate all the gestures of support they are receiving and help from the RMBI Leadership Team.



There are currently 63 residents at Cornwallis Court which equates to an occupancy rate of 93%. There are presently 4 residential vacancies and 1 room out of action for a refurb. If anyone would like more information on Cornwallis Court, please contact Denise on 01284 768028

The room is divided into 2 with a Perspex wall to prevent transmission of infection. Visits are pre-booked by telephone with the reception team. No other visiting is allowed.
